

### What is frivolite/φερβολιτέ?



**Frivolité** is a form of lace-making or tatting.

Tatting is a technique for **handcrafting** a particularly durable lace constructed by a series of knots and loops.

**In Cyprus** it's often used to create **intricate designs** for items like:

- Tablecloth
- Curtains
- Decorative edgings for clothing
- Many more

A happy **bridge** between two **cultures**.




